This recommended resource has a list on p. 33 of useful checklist for teachers with ELLs in their classes. The items of the checklist are paraphrased below:

1	Plan ahead—have resources, visuals, and vocab activities ready.
2	Use actions and acting to demonstrate vocab & ideas
3	Make frequent use of visuals!
4	Give students a study guide in simple English.
5	List both content and language objectives on the board.
6	Make use of graphic organizers.
7	Use sheltered English and repetition, restatement, and paraphrasing.
8	Employ cooperative learning / structured group work.
9	Directly teach vocab; have word walls.
10	Recycle/frequently practice the vocabulary to help students internalize it.
11	Include word banks on activities and assessments
12	Use oral and written instructions.
13	Have students mark key ideas in their reading.
14	Have a non-ELL buddy for each ELL.
15	Modify instruction to allow ELLs to participate.
16	Modify assignments according to ELLs' language level(s).
17	Modify assessments (item banks; rephrasing; fewer questions).
	Allow ELLs to use a variety of ways (speaking, writing, drawing, labeling, acting) to demonstrate understanding.
